Learning Experience Title: Pharmacy Practice Management Operations A

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Description:

The required learning experience is designed to develop understanding of sterile compounding and regulatory compliance. A pharmacist in this role is responsible for becoming familiar with USP 797, USP 800, The Joint Commission Medication Management standards, and CMS Conditions of Participation. This experience focuses upon the integration of rules and regulations into the daily operations of the department. This learning experience will be conducted by the Director of Pharmacy at TMC Lakewood.

Learning Experience Responsibilities:

- Review / discuss compliance with regulatory bodies (e.g. Joint Commission, Board of Pharmacy, DHSS, CMS)
- Review / discuss current workflow compared to other facilities / institutions
