The required learning experience is designed for the resident to develop understanding of the evolution of pharmacy automation and technology. The pharmacist in this role is responsible for overseeing medication management, dispensing bulk solutions versus unit-dose / unit-of-use methods, controlled substances unit cabinets versus automated dispensing machines, and use of electronic medical record, computer practitioner order entry, and barcode medication administration.
