General Description

Orientation is a required one month learning experience at Truman Medical Center Hospital Hill during the resident's first month. The resident will be involved in a hospital orientation, residency orientation and pharmacy orientation during this experience. The resident will be scheduled to work in different areas within the pharmacy department to develop a baseline comfort level of hospital pharmacy and the different roles staff members have. This will be further developed during service component of residency. The resident will interact with hospital pharmacist, pharmacy technicians, attending physicians, medical residents and nursing staff.

Goals and Objectives

This experience will help prepare the resident to practice as a member of the hospital pharmacy through activities listed below.

Resident Expectations

- Arrive on time to designated work area and check in with staff member that you'll be working with.
- Actively participate in tasks that are in alignment with the staff member you are working with, e.g. pulling medications from the Carousel if with the Carousel technician, verifying orders if with a pharmacist.
- After orientation, the resident should be able to complete tasks/responsibilities of those staff members they worked alongside.

Other activities to occur during orientation month

- A checklist will be provided to residents to complete during the orientation experience and will be uploaded into PharmAcademic.

Preceptor Interaction

Hospital Orientation will be completed on day 1. After hospital orientation is completed the resident will report to assigned area each day to allow for adequate exposure to all areas. Preceptor will interact with resident on a routine basis to assure that all learning needs are being achieved and necessary progress is being made.

Requirements

Expected hours will be from 0700 until 1730 or as directed by individual preceptors.

Method of Evaluation

PharmAcademic will be used for documentation of formal evaluations. During this learning experience the following evaluations will be completed: Learning Experience, Preceptor, and Summative. Evaluations will be completed by the resident and preceptor. After evaluations have been completed the resident and preceptor will discuss.
